Welcome 2021!

This year has shown us what we can accomplish, even when our lives change dramatically. We were able to show what we were capable of, in a time of great upheaval. Now we look forward to a new year, where we can continue to share our gifts in new and unique ways.

Our year will begin with LIVE Zoom worship on January 3rd at 11am (see page 4 for Zoom link.) The Zoom call will be recorded and available for viewing on our YouTube channel and our Facebook page, and we will email the link following the live service. We hope to “see” you there! This is a Holy Experiment and we will see how it goes for this one Sunday. The following Sundays will go back to previously recorded worship.

We will also be starting new Zoom Sunday school classes for all ages. Adult bible study is on Wednesday evenings at 7:00pm. Starting January 13th, the adult class will be using the book, *Emotionally Healthy Spirituality* by Peter Scazzero. This bible study series is designed to help us all experience beneath-the-surface transformation—spiritually and emotionally.

The youth Sunday school class will begin “Fight Right! A Christian Approach to Conflict Resolution.” This five part series starts Sunday January 3 at 6:30pm.

Our children will have Sunday school on Sunday mornings at 9:30am where they will continue *Shine: Living in God’s Light*—preparing children to love Jesus, grow in faith, and change the world.

In addition to our Sunday School classes, we are offering a new personal challenge to read the bible in a year. See page 5 for more information about the challenge, and page 6 for the reading schedule.

As we look ahead to the coming year, and whatever changes and challenges it may bring, we will continue to be a community of care, where relationships matter, and Christian discipleship counts.

Pastor's Page

What a year it's been! As I reflect back on 2020, I think about all the big plans we had. I started the year attending a retreat in Arizona with clergy women throughout the denomination. Our previous pastors were scheduled to preach with us monthly to celebrate our 125th Anniversary and we were all set to have a carry-in meal with each visit. Our Goals and Purpose Committee worked with our Christian Education Team to prepare Sunday School classes this past spring to talk about the issues facing our community: Creation Care, Homelessness, Families in Crisis, and Immigration/Refugee Resettlement. Our senior high youth were going to attend a workcamp in California this past summer. Then COVID-19 entered our world and turned everything upside down. Worship went online starting in the middle of March and in-person gatherings were limited while we wore masks and stayed socially distant. As we enter this 2021 year, my prayer and my hope is that we will be together in-person again soon. I also pray that we will use this time to think about what we want to get back to. How will we bounce back after this past year? Or better yet, how will we bounce forward? What new thing did we do in 2020 that we want to keep doing? How can we use this new year to grow deeper in our relationship with Jesus Christ and deeper in our relationship with each other? What does being a community of care look like in a post-pandemic world? We know we aren't through the pandemic yet, but we hold onto hope that we will get through it soon as the vaccine becomes more readily available. One thing that I know for sure is that through all the twists and turns of 2020, God is ever faithful. God is always present, God's love is never ending, and God will guide us through. May we hold onto that faith, that hope, and that trust in this new



year, and may our hearts and minds remain open to how God is leading us through it all.

2020 Ends With Christmas Joy

2020 came with a storm of changes that left us in shock, unable to comprehend how to live in this new world. Fortunately, we have an amazing church full of talented, compassionate, and loving people. As 2020 came to an end, we found new ways to celebrate Advent, mailing out Advent Calendars, Advent Devotionals, and our December newsletter to all of our families. Gilmer Akers and the Craighead family put up and decorated our Chrismon tree, so that it could be seen in our online worship service. We were able to offer Advent wreaths and candles for home use. During worship, we had a different family light the Advent candles each week. We continued to support the Un-Trim-A-Tree program, in which we were able to provide gifts to 33 children.

We raised money for Bread for the World, where folks were offered beans, preserves, and masks provided by Stephanie Polzin and Ruth Johnston to purchase to help us end world hunger. We raised \$1069 to support Bread for the World.

We were also invited to participate in Zoom Christmas Caroling, led by Susan Dommer. We combined our Blue Christmas Service with Nokesville COB and Oakton COB, providing a service for everyone needing a lift this holiday season.

Finally, our Church Board came together to provide a wonderful Christmas festival, that was held on Saturday December 26th due to inclement weather on Christmas Eve. It incorporated three separate elements: The telling of the Christmas Story with amazing cut-outs made by Steve Hollinger and signs from Patricia Grady; giving to those in need by donating hats, gloves, scarves, and blankets to SERVE, as well as a food drive to benefit SERVE, and \$1235 in donations for Carried To Full Term were made to our Christmas Eve offering. 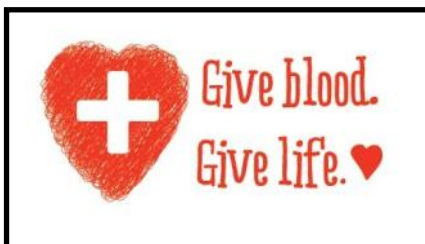

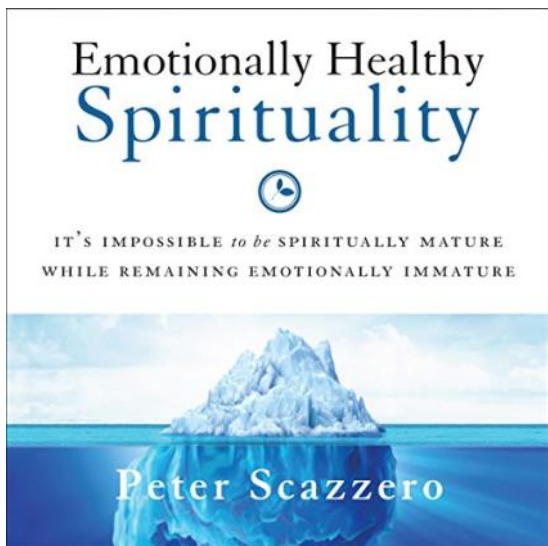

Adult Bible Study



The new Adult Bible Study will start January 13 and will use *Emotionally Healthy Spirituality* by Peter Scazzero.

It's an 8 week study with the following topics:

- The Problem of Emotionally Unhealthy Spirituality: Something is Desperately Wrong
 - Know Yourself That You May Know God: Becoming Your Authentic Self
 - Going Back in Order to Go Forward: Breaking the Power of the Past
 - Journey through the Wall: Letting Go of Power and Control
 - Enlarge Your Soul through Grief and Loss: Surrendering to Your Limits
 - Discover the Rhythms of the Daily Office and Sabbath: Stopping to Breathe the Air of Eternity
- Grow into an Emotionally Mature Adult: Learning New Skills to Love Well
 - Go the Next Step to Develop a “Rule of Life”: Loving Christ Above All Else

Michael Kline

Michael Kent Kline, 65, of Madison, Va., passed away on November 14, 2020. Born in Manassas in 1955, he was the son of the late Harley and Vera Kline.

Mr. Kline was a farmer much of his life, working a dairy farm in Manassas, where he was raised, and later farmed in Madison County.

He had most recently retired from Culpeper Co-Op where he worked for over 20 years. During his younger years, Mr. Kline loved working on muscle cars with friends and was a lifelong fan of MOPAR. Collecting firearms and shooting were hobbies of his and deer season always brought friends to the farm for early breakfasts and days hunting out on the farm. Mr. Kline will be remembered for his fun and good nature. He was a man that would take care of things that needed to be done and always willing to lend a hand and his experience to others. He loved his family dearly and his passing is greatly felt.

Those that survive him are his wife Lisa, his son Michael Kline and wife Beverlee of Rockingham County, his son Jason Kline and wife Mirna of Madison County, and stepdaughter Anna-Lise' Bohrer of Locust Dale; three siblings, Kathy Miller and husband David of Pa.; Ruth Mickelberry and husband David of Madison County, Christa Harrell and husband Louis of Manassas; four grandchildren Isabella, Brian, Nadia, and Emmett.

Harold House



Harold Ellis House, age 62, died Friday, November 13, 2020 surrounded by his loving family. Harold was born January 31, 1958 in Warrenton, Virginia to the late Ewing Michael House and Wilma Lee Wood House. He lived in Nokesville for most of his life and treasured his family, farm and community.

Growing up on his family's dairy, Dutchland Farms, Harold cultivated a life long love of agriculture. As a member of the Prince William 4-H Dairy Club, he showed Holstein dairy cows at local and regional fairs. While a member of the Nokesville FFA club at Brentsville District High School, he was awarded the American Farmer Degree and was part of the dairy judging team that won the state contest in 1974; individually he placed 8th at the National Contest the same year.

He continued his education at Virginia Tech graduating in 1980 with a BS in Dairy Science. During his time there he was an active member of the Dairy Club and member of the Alpha Zeta Honor Fraternity. Following graduation, Harold's profession centered on dairy cattle genetics, working as District Sales Manager for Manco Genetics in Southwest Virginia. He was promoted to Sales Director, helping dairy farmers in the Virginia, West Virginia and North Carolina area. In 1987, he returned to the family farm where he dedicated his life to developing the family dairy herd. He also served the greater agriculture community as president of the Prince William/Fauquier Holstein Association, director of the Virginia Holstein Association, and Chairman of the Northern Virginia Farm Service Agency. He was currently serving on the board of directors for Genex Cooperative (URUS), a global company, affording him the opportunity to help shape the direction of animal agriculture genetics for years to come.

Additionally his service gave him opportunities to travel and meet farmers from around the world. He found this service with Genex to be especially meaningful and fulfilling. Harold was raised in Greenwich Presbyterian Church, where he once served as a deacon, and also was an attendee at the Manassas Church of the Brethren.

Harold is survived by his High School sweetheart and wife of 42 years Donna Kline. They had three children, Daniel House and wife Rebecca (Weyers Cave, VA), Lora Vasquez and husband Javier (Manassas Park, VA), and Brian House and wife Laura (Union Bridge, MD) and 6 grandchildren, Bethany, Leo, Sasha, Hailey, Emma, Kathleen, and an additional grandson due in February. Harold's grandchildren held a special place in his heart, Grandad could always make them laugh and smile. He had two brothers Paul House and wife Mary (Nokesville, VA) and Dale House and wife Lisa (Nokesville, VA). Harold is predeceased by his parents, his Sister Julia (Judy) Mayhugh, her husband William (Billy), and Sister-in-law, Flora House.

In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, the FaithX team has developed alternative FaithX options for summer 2021.

The four 2021 FaithX options, and their cost, are as follows:

Tier 1 – \$75: In this tier, participants will serve in their local communities during the day, either individually or with other members of their congregation

Tier 2 – \$235: In this tier, participants will serve in their local area with other members of their congregation during the day. In the evening, they will gather together physically, in a socially-distant manner, for dinner, devotions, and activities.

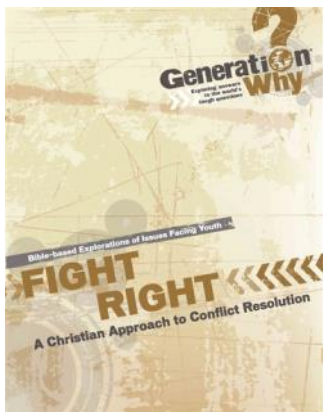
Tier 3 – \$285: In this tier, participants will serve locally with other congregations in their region during the day. In the evening, they will gather together physically, in a socially-distant manner, for dinner, devotions, and activities.

Tier 4 – \$350: In this tier, participants will participate in a “normal” FaithX experience. FaithX participants from around the country will travel to a FaithX location, stay together in local housing accommodations (church or camp), and serve together for the week.

At a minimum, the Manassas Church of the Brethren is hoping to be able to participate in Tier 1 this summer, even if we have to coordinate service opportunities where we wear masks, stay socially distant, and serve outdoors. We are also exploring the possibility of working with other NOVA CoBs for Tier 3 where each day we travel throughout Northern VA to serve with friends from other congregations.
