On the last Saturday in January, our 2024 Church Board met for their annual retreat. The theme this year as "The Stories We Tell" with a focus on Mark 4 and Jesus' parables. 

Mid-Atlantic District Query

Engaging the Query

The Mid-Atlantic District received a query from the Arlington congregation that was distributed at the 2023 Mid-Atlantic District Conference and will be included in the business for the 2024 District Conference. A "query" is a congregation's way of asking a question to the broader denomination. Should the 2024 District Conference pass the query, it would be received by Standing Committee as a the query possible item of business for the 2025 Annual Conference. Standing Committee reviews and recommends action for all such received business prior to Annual Conference

THE QUERY repeats Standing Committee's assertion that LGBTQ+ people experience discrimination even in Brethren contexts, including "violence, bullying, and a general sense of dismissal." It wonders if changes to denominational statements would help minimize risks of future harm.

AS A DISTRICT, we are seeking to engage and understand the query prior to discerning and voting on it at District Conference in October of 2024. Regional and online engagement sessions will be held to provide information, answer questions, and share in meaningful dialogue.

Our District Conference Delegates Mary Jane P., Rob D., Devon H., and Pastor Mandy will be attending a Query session on February 3rd from 10:00am—11:30am. If you want to be part of the conversation there is a Zoom session on February 20th from 7:00pm—8:30pm. Please contact the district office at <u>AAMAD@brethren.org.</u>

At these sessions, we will not be deciding whether to advance the Query to Annual Conference; that vote will take place at the 2024 Mid-Atlantic District Conference. Rather, we hope to find a better understanding of the Query and the motivations behind it. Participants are invited to engage the query, turning away an "us-versus-them" model. We hope all participants can share, listen, seek to understand, and learn from the convictions of others.





A NEW VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY TO HELP HOMEBOUND PEOPLE IN THE COMMUNITY GET FOOD - Tina Fisher

House of Mercy is launching a new and improved Mobile Pantry Program. The Mobile Pantry Program provides fresh food, personalized options, and the opportunity to make personal connections with the people that will be served through this unique program. This program will specifically serve the homebound. These individuals are very likely isolated and suffering from lack of human connection. Your role in bringing them food deliveries will be about sustaining the body as well as the spirit.

Deliveries will be made during normal Food Pantry hours of operation; Monday-Friday, 10am-4pm. The volunteers will be required to use their own vehicles and GPS devices to make deliveries. House of Mercy is purchasing a refrigerated vehicle that will eventually be available for volunteer use. There will be 2 shifts-morning from 9:30am-1pm and afternoon from 1pm-4:30pm.

This role will require lifting, bending, walking, and assisting with unloading of groceries. In addition, it requires someone who is a good listener, empathetic, kind and patient.
