Discover where joy is sprinkled throughout the narrative. Identify the moments when joy arrives-despite trepidation, fear, or grief. And consider how joy can be a companion to you this season, for our joy is rotted in the truth that we belong to God. Can you tether yourself to that deep truth? You deserve to feel joy-fully. The world needs your joy, even if you are weary. Join us for this season of advent as we consider "How Can a Weary World Rejoice?" using worship resources from A Sanctified Art.

From the Pastor's Study

n October 7, our world changed. Hamas led an attack on Israel and violence has been pervasive ever since. As war broke out on the other side of the world, tensions were felt here in our own community. Unity in the Community was already scheduled to host a viewing of "Repairing the World," a documentary about the Tree of Life synagogue shooting and how Pittsburgh came together as community following this tragedy. Originally, Dar Al Noor, the mosque on Hoadly Rd, was planning to host this event in their community center on October 15, just a week after the attacks on the other side of the world began. Unfortunately, as preparations were made, the leaders of the mosque determined that it would not be a safe venue for this event and were no longer able to host it. Members of the mosque have families in Gaza who have been victims of the violence.

K nowing how important it was to keep the event and to hold space for conversations around antisemitism, Illana Naylor asked if the Manassas Church of the Brethren could host at the last minute. With the help of a few congregants, we made all the arrangements necessary in just a few short days and hosted the event here in our sanctuary and fellowship hall. Sharon Haydon and Illana Naylor worked hard to set everything up and create a welcoming space. This created a safe space for dialogue for our community in the midst of conflict.

t the same time, our neighbors at Dar Al **Noor were preparing to host a** non-partisan candidate forum for the two candidates running for the Board of County Supervisors Chair position the same weekend as the documentary viewing. The day before their event, they reached out to see if I could help co-moderate the forum, as a local community leader and strategy member of VOICE. Knowing the tensions surrounding the documentary viewing, I agreed to serve in this role. By co-moderating the candidate forum on Saturday, October 14 for our Muslim neighbors and then hosting the documentary viewing on Sunday, October 15 for our Jewish neighbors, it just felt like a way to shine peace in our conflicted world.

S ometimes, we can get overwhelmed by the news we see on T.V. and we wonder what we can do to make a difference. Sometimes, I wonder if the way we make a difference is by loving our neighbors close to home.

During this Advent season as we ponder how a weary world rejoices, especially in the midst of all the turmoil and strife today, may we take a moment to pause and see the good that is possible when we open our hearts and our hands to the community around us.

Many thanks for your generosity in bringing much-needed joy to the faces of these children this Christmas season!




Our children have been knitting together a Christmas Musical! Come see them present "A Christmas Yarn" on December 10th at 6:30pm.
